Tradition of Excellence

The Ohio Department of Education recently released the 2010-11 District Local Report Cards. The District Local Report Card for the 2010-11 school year shows the progress districts have made based on four measures of performance. The four measures are state indicators, performance index, adequate yearly progress, and value-added. The combination of the four measures is the basis for assigning state designations to districts and buildings.

The Anthony Wayne Local Schools received another Excellent designation based on the combination of the four measures. First measure- The district met 26 out of 26 state indicators that measures student proficiency levels, attendance rates, and graduation rates. Second measure- The performance index for the district was 106.4 compared to 104.0 last year. Approximately 66% of all state tests taken were scored accelerated or advance (the highest two levels of performance). Third measure- The district met the federal requirement of adequate yearly progress. Fourth measure- The district met the value-added measure. Thus, our student performance was within the range of expected performance based on previous testing.

The Excellent district rating is the result of the commitment to education within the Anthony Wayne community. I would like to thank the parents, the community, and our staff for providing the foundation to make the tradition of excellence a reality in our district. I would like to thank our students for their efforts to arrive at school prepared for learning and their preparation for and performance on these assessments. The Anthony Wayne Local Schools will continue to work on this strong academic performance as we move toward a more rigorous set of standards and changes in assessments from the Ohio Department of Education.
